Ten Lessons The Arts Teach by Elliot Eisner

The arts teach children to make good judgments about qualitative relationships.

The arts teach children that problems can have more than one solution and that questions can have more than one answer.

The arts celebrate multiple perspectives.

The arts teach children that in complex forms of problem solving purposes are seldom fixed, but change with circumstance and opportunity.

The arts make vivid the fact that neither words in their literal form nor numbers exhaust what we can know.

The arts teach students that small differences can have large effects.

The arts teach students to think through and within a material.

The arts help children learn to say what cannot be said.

The arts enable us to have experience we can have from no other source and through such experience to discover the range and variety of what we are capable of feeling.

The arts' position in the school curriculum symbolizes to the young what adults believe is important.

Tours at FMOA are an introduction to the wonderful world of art and are tailored to fit various age groups. Through age-appropriate interactive gallery discussions, creative visual aids and educational activities, your group's visit to FMOA will instill an appreciation for the visual arts.

Hands-On Tour

Explore our current exhibit on a guided tour and then enjoy an art lesson and project about the exhibit. The museum displays six rotating exhibitions throughout the year. A minimum of 10 and a maximum of 50 people.

Hands-On Tours for Students with Special Needs

Join FMOA as we offer an enriching art experience for audiences with special needs. Students, parents and teachers alike will have fun exploring the combination of tours, cultural artifacts and hands-on art. Art projects will focus on highlighting various abilities through the use of adaptive art materials. Activities will enhance fine motor skills, provide tactile stimulation, and offer opportunities for social interaction and communication skills practice.

- Learn how works have been built by a process of addition, subtraction, and division.
- Learn how artists make use of geometric shapes, such as triangles, circles and angles in their works of art.
- Learn to explore how artists use symmetry and asymmetry in the ways they present their subject.

Learn about artists who lived and worked in North Carolina. What kinds of art did they make? What did they want to show other people about their art? Students will be exposed to the variety of working artists and their role in our community and state.
